

## 2020 STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce the availability of the 2020 Richard 'Dik' Days Scholarship application. The Scholarship Committee will use this application for the scholarship selection process.

The Richard 'Dik' Days Scholarship Fund is an initiative formed through collaboration between the Coalition of Black Trade Unionists (CBTU) Connecticut Chapter, the International Union, United Automobile, Aerospace & Agricultural Implement Workers of America (UAW) Region 9A and the Days Family.

The Richard 'Dik' Days Scholarship Fund is created in memory of Richard Adam Days, who was a labor educator for the UAW. Prior to his retirement he was the Education & Civil Rights Director for the UAW, Region 9A. Brother Days was a rigorous trade unionist, political activist and community advocate. As a labor educator, Dik worked endlessly to educate union and non-union workers, their families and young adults on labor history, the contributions of organized labor in the workplace and the rights of workers. He was a member of the UAW for over 40 years, a charter member of the National Coalition of Black Trade Unionists, co-founder and former President of the Connecticut Chapter of the Coalition of Black Trade Unionists, co-founder of the Connecticut Chapter of the A. Phillip Randolph Institute, a lifetime member of the NAACP, a lifetime member of the African American Alliance, and a six term member of the Bloomfield Town Council. Brother Days had an impact on many lives and helped those he touched to better understand their role in the Union and the communities in which we serve.

If you are a graduating high school senior attending college full-time in the fall or a current undergraduate student, enrolled full-time in a college/university you are eligible to apply for this scholarship. Qualifying applicants must also meet the minimum requirements noted below. Two \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded in 2020. If you are awarded a scholarship, you will be asked to provide your social security number and student ID number for the college/university. Scholarship funds will be sent directly to the college/university in which you are enrolled for use towards your academic financial needs.

You will be notified by May 29, 2020 if you are selected as a scholarship recipient. If you have any questions or concerns please contact Donna Becotte at (860) 674-0143.

Please check each item below to verify that you understand the qualification requirements. Failure to comply with all requirements will disqualify your application.

\_\_\_\_\_ **DEADLINE May 1, 2020.** Complete applications, including all requested documentation must be received by the Scholarship Committee by the deadline date, including SAT or ACT scores, an official school transcript and a photograph. Current college students need only submit official transcript of grades. The deadline date is the latest date and time your application will be accepted by the Scholarship Committee. NO EXTENSIONS will be granted. **Your name and address should clearly appear on each page of documentation. Applications will only be accepted via email submission.** 

**Brief Biography:** including offices held, major accomplishments, other scholarships/awards, volunteer and community services performed, hobbies, etc.

Official School Transcript SAT/ACT Scores: if you are a high school graduating senior, provide a copy of your official high school transcript and a copy of your SAT or ACT Score Card.

Proof of Enrollment in an Accredited College/University: please provide proof of enrollment for the upcoming school year, and the Official college/university name, address, to whose attention and where the scholarship award should be sent.
