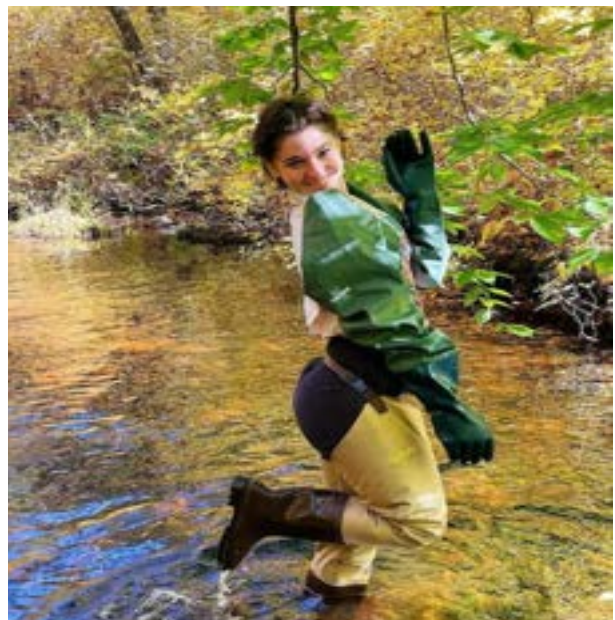

# Christian Robinson's Oxford Experience

## *A Global Learning Opportunity*



Through the support of the Foundation, Christian Robinson, a student at Three Rivers, was granted a life-changing opportunity to attend the Oxford Consortium for Human Rights in July 2024. The Foundation generously covered all major expenses, including flights, transportation, tuition, room, and board, allowing Christian to fully immerse himself in this transformative experience.



The Oxford Consortium for Human Rights is a unique network of universities and community colleges committed to the teaching and practice of universal human rights. It offers students, particularly those from underrepresented and low-income backgrounds, the chance to engage in intensive workshops and seminars alongside Oxford faculty and global human rights leaders. Christian's participation in this program exemplifies the impact of such opportunities on our students' academic and personal growth.

Reflecting on his time at Oxford, Christian shared his gratitude:

Studying in such a historic and prestigious environment was inspiring, and the knowledge and insights I gained have already started to shape my approach to my studies. 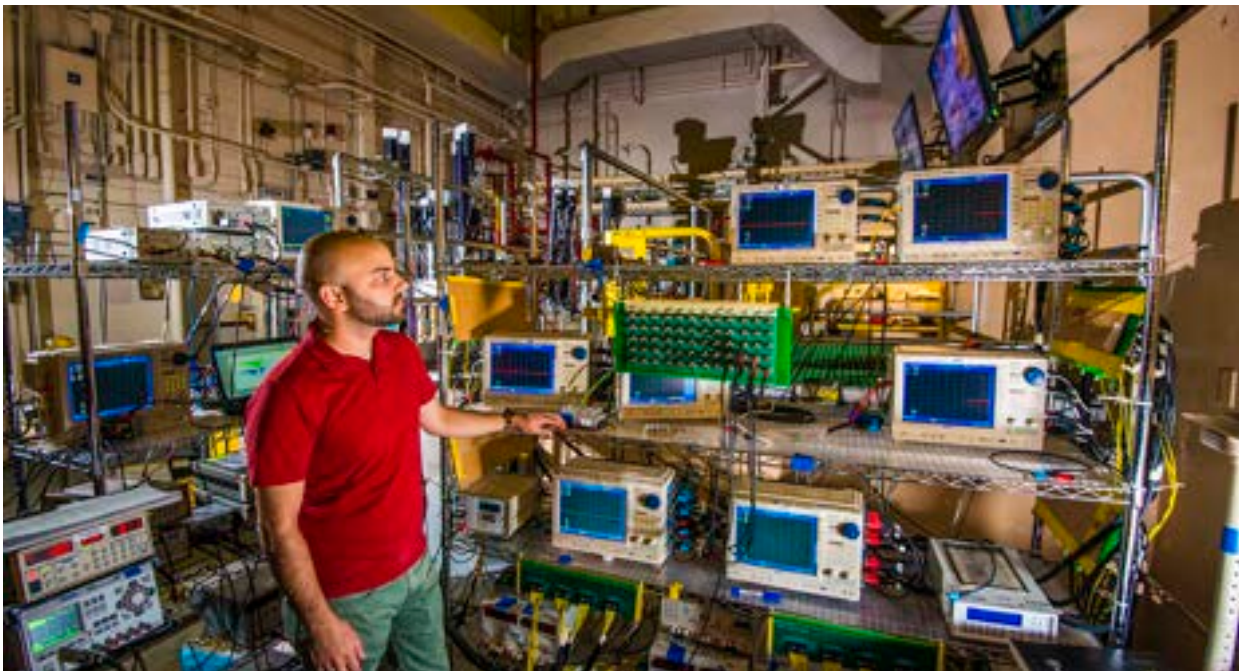
# Strengthening Our Partnership with Dominion Energy

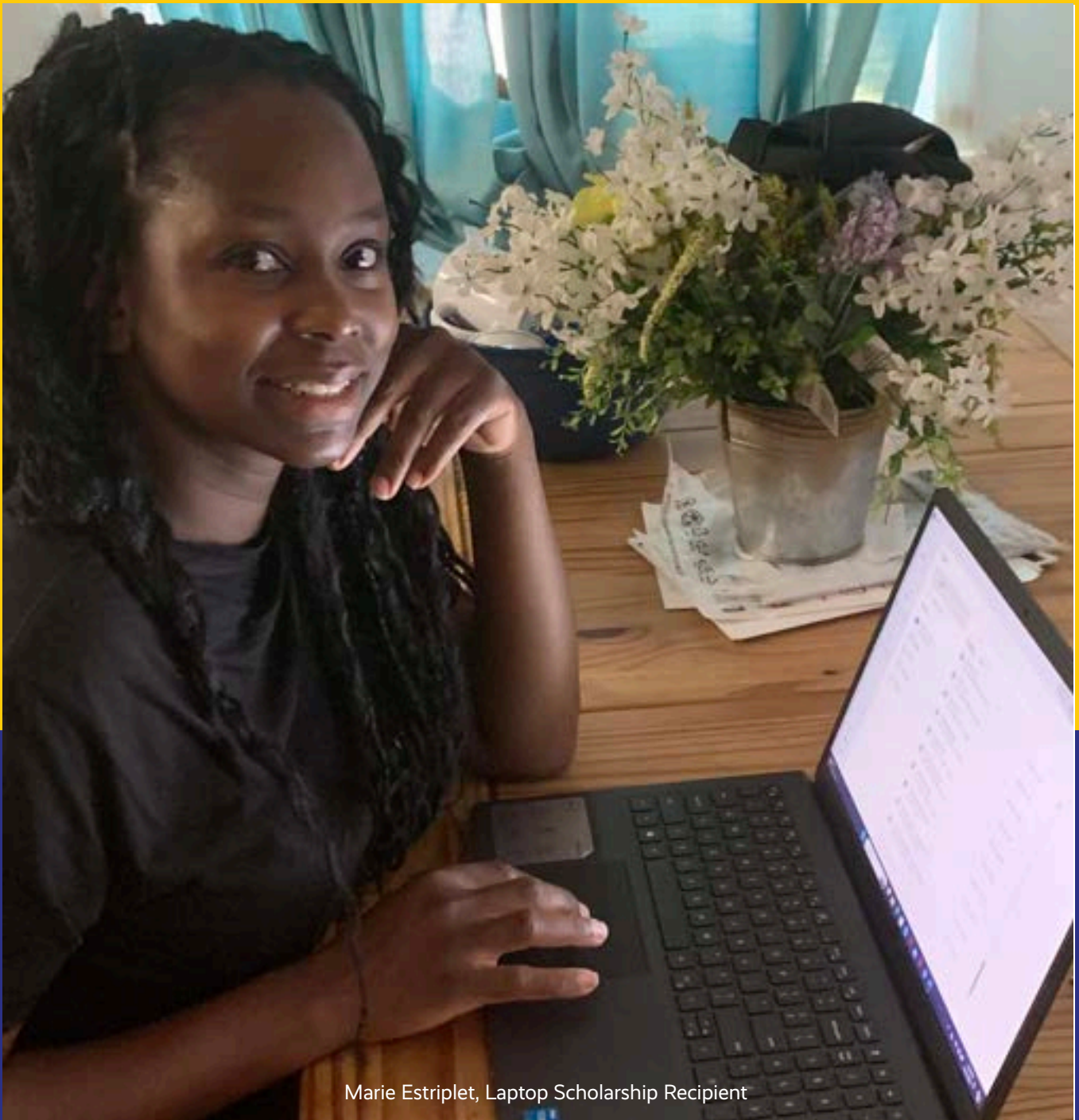
